## WHAT WE DO

**At KAICIID, we are both convenors and facilitators. We equip religious communities with the knowledge and skills about policy frameworks, human rights and sustainable development, while also training policymakers on religious literacy, interreligious dialogue and inclusion. Our organization connects religious actors, policymakers and experts so that they can find common solutions to shared problems and global challenges.**

We support these actors through training programmes, workshops and partnerships, and by developing and implementing multilateral solutions that are inclusive and representative.



### We Build Capacity

Dialogue training is at the forefront of many of our programmes. Through e-learning and online resources, our Fellows Programme and partnerships with international organizations such as the World Organization of the Scout Movement, we work with dialogue experts around the world to give people the tools to mainstream dialogue in their communities.



### We Convene

As a convener, KAICIID establishes and supports interreligious networks and dialogue platforms around the globe, hosts conferences, local workshops and other fora. We bring together religious leaders and policymakers to promote dialogue as a fundamental aspect of policymaking aimed at tackling global problems such as climate change, inequality and poverty. We aim to recognise and promote the invaluable contributions of religious communities to peace and development, and to work with them to solve global challenges.



### We Work Regionally

Whether it is due to religious differences or conflict over land or resources, dialogue is essential in jointly overcoming challenges. Our programmes promote social cohesion through dialogue in communities around the world. We build platforms where sustained dialogue can take place in conflict-prone situations, and in societies and local communities in Africa, the Arab region, Asia and Europe.

Our KAICIID Fellows Programme starts with one year of hybrid training, as an ongoing capacity development and networking programme that connects, cultivates, and inspires emerging leaders – religious leaders, educators, and interreligious dialogue experts – from different religious backgrounds and nationalities.

The Fellows Alumni Network equips and empowers Fellows committed to interreligious and intercultural dialogue facilitation. It provides graduates with continuing networking and professional development opportunities to achieve lasting outcomes.

The newly launched Institutional Network builds cooperation between affiliated higher education institutions to mainstream quality interreligious dialogue curricula.

## KAICIID IN EUROPE

Guided by three thematic pillars, our Europe Region Programme (ERP) unites religious leaders and policymakers to address some of the continent's most pressing needs.

### Europe Region Programme (ERP)

The work of the ERP focuses on countering hate speech, tackling acts of violence committed in the name of religion, and fostering inclusive education for and with refugees and migrants. In support of people seeking refuge in Europe, we co-host the yearly European Policy Dialogue Forum (EPDF), which addresses the current direction of refugee and migration policies in Europe.

To counter prejudice, disinformation, attacks and violence against Muslims, Jews, and other minority religious groups in Europe, we actively support the Muslim Jewish Leadership Council (MJLC), a unique platform that unites over 50 Muslim and Jewish leaders from more than 20 countries.



## WHERE WE WORK

### KAICIID AROUND THE WORLD

**At the global level, we foster social cohesion and peaceful societies by promoting interreligious and intercultural dialogue through capacity-building, partnering with international organizations and by providing access to online resources and e-learning opportunities.**

We are active in many countries around the world, with a particular focus on Asia, Africa, the Arab region and Europe. We have supported the establishment of five dialogue platforms in our focus regions which are true examples of interreligious cooperation as a counterweight to the manipulation of religion for violence.

In these focus regions, we collaborate with local civil society and faith-based and non-governmental organizations to address issues such as hate speech prevention, inclusive education and the protection of religious sites. We offer training in conflict-sensitive journalism, teach skills to use social media to prevent conflict, and foster interfaith education and exchange together with our collaborators on the ground.

### OUR GLOBAL INTERRELIGIOUS DIALOGUE INITIATIVES

#### Europe

Established the Muslim Jewish Leadership Council (MJLC), supported by the European Muslim Leaders Majlis (EuLeMa). Launched the Network for Dialogue.

#### Arab Region

Launched the Interreligious Platform for Dialogue and Cooperation in the Arab World (IPDC), the Network for Religious Christian and Muslim Faculties and Institutes in the Arab World (NRFI) and the Social Media Regional Network.

#### Asia

Supported establishment of the Southeast Asia Dialogue Cities Conference.

#### Africa

Supported the Peace Journalists Network and the Plateforme des Confessions Religieuses de Centrafrique (PCRC) in the Central African Republic. Established the Interfaith Dialogue Forum for Peace (IDFP) and the Network of Policy Makers to Support Reconciliation, Peace and Security in Nigeria.
