He has published many scholarly books and articles, and his most recent is Making Peace with Faith (2018).

AND METHODOLOGY

This interactive digital course is specifically designed for busy professionals who do not have time to take the longer, moderated six-module course on 'Engaging Faith Actors to Support the Implementation Process of the SDGs'. They can now select the relevant thematic topics and modules and learn on the go. Administered through a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) platform, this short course takes around two hours to complete and can be taken anywhere, anytime, at a pace that suits and from a phone or a computer.
